## **TIFTON CAMPUS**

The Center for Invasive Species & Ecosystem Health has been formally established at the University of Georgia to address issues on invasive species and ecosystem (agricultural, forested and natural system) health.

The Center, housed at the University of Georgia Tifton Campus, evolved from the Bugwood Network that developed through faculty cooperation between the College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences and the Warnell School of Forestry and Natural Resources at the University of Georgia. The Center will serve a lead role in development, consolidation and dissemination of information and programs focused on invasive species, forest health, natural resource and agricultural management through technology development, program implementation, training, applied research and public awareness. It operates 20 websites that received 147 million hits from 23 million users last year.
