Judging criteria

- * Organization - (20 points) - sequence of topics logical and effective; introduction, body of talk, and conclusions coherent; time well used.
- * Delivery - (20 points) - poise, audibility, expression, eye contact, use of pointer.
- * Visual aids - (20 points) - appropriate for subject matter, legible, eye appealing.
- * Subject matter - (30 points) - important questions addressed, appropriate methods.
- * Handling of questions - (10 points) - questions made clear to audience; answers logical and appropriate.
- * Conformation to time constraints - (maximum 8 point penalty) - deduct 1 point for each 15 seconds over time or 30 seconds under time limit.

Submitted papers should be 8 minutes long with 2 minutes for discussion. **Authors must send a PowerPoint presentation by email, CD, flash drive (memory stick)** to gaentsoc@uga.edu or mail to:

Use **bold** for the **presenter's name**. INCLUDE ADDRESS, TELEPHONE, AND E-MAIL FOR PRESENTING AUTHOR TO BE NOTIFIED OF ACCEPTANCE.

Designate the section for submission. All submissions will be entered into the appropriate competition.

EXAMPLE ABSTRACT

Release of Predatory Mites for Control of Pecan Leaf Scorch Mite Jim Dutcher

Abstract Western predatory mite release in the center tree of a one acre block of pecan trees lead to control of pecan leaf scorch mite in four weeks over the entire one acre plot. Acramite was found to kill pecan leaf scorch mite and conserve phytoseiid mites. In the following season, western predatory mite was established in the orchard and Acramite controlled scorch mites for six weeks whereas standard materials only controlled mites for two weeks. High levels of rainfall during the trial tends to indicate that the increased

Guidelines for the Georgia Entomological Society Scholarships

In March of 1988, The Georgia Entomological Society established an Entomology Scholarship in its name for the purpose of furthering entomological science and knowledge by providing financial assistance to outstanding graduate students of Entomology. Separate scholarships, each valued at \$500.00, and a commemorative plaque are provided for M.S and Ph.D. students and awarded at the annual meeting awards banquet.

Eligibility:

- 1) The scholarship is open to all student members of the Georgia Entomological Society who matriculate in a college or university in the United States.
- 2) A student must have been accepted by a college or university for enrollment in a graduate program and be actively pursuing a post-graduate degree in either Entomology, Acarology or in Biology with a major track in either of these two disciplines.

Selection Criteria:

- 1) Letter of recommendation from an official of the nominating institution.
- 2) Letter of acceptance from graduate school (for new students) or other proof of graduate student status.
- 3) A letter of recommendation from at least one professional entomologist who is a GES member.
- 4) Curriculum Vitae – This should include, but not be limited to:
 - a. A short narrative regarding undergraduate and/or graduate accomplishments, i.e., detailing of any research project(s) in which the student participated and/or any teaching assistance rendered, papers presented or grants received.
 - b. Grade point average(s) and GRE or equivalent scores should be included.
 - c. A narrative relating to future goals leading to a career in Entomology or an associated field.

CATEGORIES: **Portrait** – close-up photo of a living insect. **Biology** – photo that ‘tells a story’ of how insects live and/or die. **Sequence** – 3-5 photos describing insect biology. **Microscopic** – photo of living insect, non-living insect or insect material (light microscope or electron microscope).

FORMAT: Only photographs with a horizontal format will be accepted (this limitation is based on the format for the journal cover). Limit of 2 individual slides per category and one sequence per participant.

DIGITAL IMAGE REQUIREMENTS: Digital images submitted for consideration **for cover photos** must be saved and submitted as TIFF files in the highest resolution available. Other file types (JPEG, etc.) will be accepted, but will not be eligible for cover photographs.

Submission of Digital images: If less than 1 megabyte, e-mail to asparks@uga.edu. If digital image is larger, go to <ftp://asparks@www.tifton.uga.edu>. Log in with the user name “asparks” and the password “tifton”. Simply drag or paste your file onto the white area of the ftp page. Be sure to indicate the name of the entrant and a description of the image. **E-mail notification of file transfer** and additional information to asparks@uga.edu.

DEADLINE: All entries must be received **by 27 February 2009**.

JUDGING: Criteria for judging are excellence of photographic technique and aesthetic appeal, clarity of purpose, and scientific accuracy.

Winners will be selected for each category, and one photo will be selected as Best of Show. Four photos will be chosen from the total pool of photos to appear on the cover of the *Journal of Entomological Science*.
